Cardiac	2	BLS Provider CPR	The BLS Course is an AHA CPR course that trains participants to promptly recognize several life-threatening emergencies, give high-quality chest compressions, deliver appropriate ventilations and provide early use of an AED.
Cardiac	2	Cardiac Emergencies	When faced with a cardiac emergency, time is critical. Detect the signs of cardiac emergencies, learn focused assessment techniques and the latest intervention strategies to manage priorities, minimize complications and improve patient outcomes.
Leadership	16	EMS Leadership	Develop the leadership abilities of incident commanders and department educators.
Legal	2	EMS Documentation	Review competent Patient Care Report (PCR) including assessment findings, scene descriptions and which details to include where and why.

Medical	21.5	Advanced Wilderness Life Support	Learn the skills to prevent medical problems, reduce suffering, and save lives in non-traditional medical settings.
Medical	2	Airway Management	Routine airway management including positioning, suctioning, adjuncts, and working with ALS devices including rapid sequence intubation, and difficult airway management.
Medical	2	Asthma In Depth	Is asthma an autoimmune disease, a stress problem, or just a respiratory problem? Take a look at the pathophysiology of asthma and current treatments.
Medical	2	Behavioral Emergencies	Explores psychiatric emergencies and behavioral crises, mental illness, and mind-altering substances. Assess a person who exhibits signs and symptoms of a psychiatric emergency or a behavioral crisis and determine what kind of emergency care is required.
Medical	4	BLS Competencies	BLS competency program that is geared toward confirming baseline competency in the EMT.
Medical	2	Congestive Heart Failure (CHF)	Congestive Heart Failure review. Pathophysiology, signs and symptoms, pre-hospital treatments and classic patient presentations.
Medical	1	Diabetes Jeopardy	A review of the signs symptoms and care of various diabetic emergencies in an interactive format.
Medical	2	Diabetic Emergencies	Recognize the many presentations of diabetes, the emergency treatments, and when patients can - and cannot - refuse care.
Medical	16	Difficult Airway Course	Learn the full range of airway management techniques — including use of video laryngoscopes & other advanced imaging devices, extraglottic devices, drug-assisted intubation and cricothyrotomy.
Medical	2	Excited Delirium	Introduction on excited delirium, autism, Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD), epilepsy (SUDEP), and other agitated chaotic events (ACE).

Medical	8	Fundamentals of Airway Management	A one-day course designed for Basic and Intermediate EMS providers and other medical professionals who may be required to manage a patient's airway before transport to a hospital. This course can also be tailored for dentists and office-based physicians.
Medical	8	Geriatric Education for EMS (GEMS)	EMS practitioners at all levels with the skills and knowledge to address the unique medical, social, environmental and communications challenges of older adults. Developed by NAEMT, in partnership with the American Geriatrics Society, GEMS empowers EMS practitioners to help improve medical outcomes and quality of life for geriatric patients.
Medical	2	Geriatrics	The geriatric patient is a different, more fragile but stronger than we expect. Learn to interpret the subtle clues to medical and trauma issues in our older patients.
Medical	3	Patient Assessment - The Interview	A review of the best practices and techniques for interviewing a patient and getting all the information.
Medical	2	Pit Crew High Performance CPR	CPR training that includes real-time audiovisual feedback and emphasizes a team approach to prehospital care for cardiac arrest patients.
Medical	3	Respiratory Emergencies	Anatomy, Physiology, Pathophysiology, and current treatments of respiratory emergencies.
Medical	8	Sick Not Sick	Designed to help EMS providers develop rapid patient assessment skills, this program distills years of field experience into a workable formula that both inexperienced and experienced providers can use in the field. It teaches providers how to quickly collect information to immediately offer initial care based upon his or her observations.
Medical	2	Stroke Awareness	New treatments for stroke, which improve chances even the worst stroke cases — If you act quickly. Learn how to recognize stroke, current treatments, and how BLS can make a profound difference in the life of a stroke patient.
Medical	3	Summer Emergencies	Summer produces its own challenges for EMS. This course looks at hyperthermia cases, heat exhaustion, heat stroke, causes, and BLS treatments.
Medical	2	Vital Signs Review	Review of vital signs, trending, and the best practices for assessing vital signs.
Medical	3	Winter Emergencies	Winter produces its own challenges for EMS. This course looks at frost-bite and hypothermia, causes, and BLS treatments.
OB	3	Obstetrical Emergencies	Review procedures for handling pregnancy and delivery.
OB	3	Pediatric and OB Review	A course that is designed to provide core knowledge in Pediatric Emergency Medicine for healthcare providers. Going beyond basic resuscitation, it is designed to meet the skills and knowledge needed for EMS to address serious pediatric diseases and problems.
OB	2	Taking Care of the Pregnant Patient	Review of pregnancy and delivery of the newborn
Ops	4	Blood Borne Pathogen/Hazcom/Right to Know	Blood borne infections and exposure prevention. This course satisfies the OSHA annual requirement for employees.
Ops	4	CBRNE Awareness	First Responders who operate at the CBRNE awareness level. The lecture familiarizes you with weapons of mass destruction, terrorism and the defense actions they should use in response to a terrorist incident.

Ops	8	CBRNE Hospital	The various mass casualty hazards/threats that may impact healthcare delivery and the appropriate planning and training initiatives that need to be undertaken in order to make hospital staff and leadership more resilient during a crisis.
Ops	4	CBRNE Operations	First Responders who operate at the CBRNE operations level. The lecture familiarizes you with weapons of mass destruction, terrorism and the defense actions they should use in response to a terrorist incident.
Ops	2	CDC Field Triage Decision Scheme	Initial triage for the MCI. Develop your effective triage strategies for 30 seconds or less per patient.
Ops	6	CEVO 4	CEVO offers comprehensive coverage of collision-prevention techniques, including the Cushion of Safety, Scanning, Vehicle Positioning, Handling Blind Spots, Parking Procedures, and more.
Ops	4	CEVO Maneuvering	Low speed serpentine, backing, parallel parking, and vehicle inspection. CEVO-III Ambulance classroom attendance is a pre-requisite for this behind the wheel skill session. Call our office for specific course requirements.
Ops	6	Coaching the Experienced Driver	CEVO offers comprehensive coverage of collision-prevention techniques, including the Cushion of Safety, Scanning, Vehicle Positioning, Handling Blind Spots, Parking Procedures, and more.
Ops	2	Communications	Review the early days of communication, and current technology, various types of communication tools, interpersonal and interagency communication, radio etiquette, and multiple real-time dispatched calls are reviewed.
Ops	8	Confined Space Operations	Those who enter confined spaces with potential hazards are required to receive confined space safety training. OSHA requires employers to develop a written confined space entry permit program and provide employee training in confined space safety.
Ops	6	Defensive Driving DDC	Emphasizing the importance of driving defensively, the techniques included will prepare you to avoid collisions and survive those you can't. This course is approved for NJ driver license point reduction, and can be submitted to NJ automobile insurance companies for rate reductions.
Ops	16	Emergency Response to Terrorism	This course is for first responders who are likely to arrive first on the scene of a radiological/nuclear incident.
Ops	2	EMS Interaction with Search and Rescue	Introduction to search and rescue, and how EMS interact during an emergency.
Ops	4	EMS Operations	A detailed study of the knowledge and skills to safely manage the scene of an emergency.
Ops	4	EMS Response to LSI-Awareness	EMS Response to Large Scale Incident - Awareness
Ops	16	EMS Response to LSI-Operations	EMS Response to Large Scale Incident - Operations
Ops	8	EMS Safety	How to protect yourself and patients while on the job. Promotes a culture of safety and reduces the number of on-the-job fatalities and injuries. EMS Safety is the only national, comprehensive safety course for EMS practitioners. Its interactive format features real-life case studies and compelling discussions on current safety issues, and provides participants with a forum to share their own experiences. Critical thinking stations help build participants' risk assessment and decision-making skills.

Ops	4	Hazmat Awareness	Recognize a hazardous materials release and the risks involved. Identify the released material, how to use available resources, and how to notify the proper authorities in the event of a hazardous material emergency.
Ops	2	Health Effects of CBRNE	Review the immediate and long term health effects of CBRNE exposure.
Ops	2	Helicopter Operations	Review the usage and management of air medical operations.
Ops	2	Hospital Designations and What It Means	A review of hospital offerings/designations, and selection criteria.
Ops	2	Human Trafficking	Identify and report suspected human trafficking.
Ops	2	ICS 100	Introduction to the Incident Command System (ICS) and the foundation for higher level ICS training. This course describes the history, features and principles, and organizational structure of the Incident Command System.
Ops	12	ICS 200	Designed to enable personnel to operate efficiently during an incident or event within the Incident Command System (ICS). Training and resources for personnel who are likely to assume a supervisory position within the ICS.
Ops	18	ICS 300	Training and resources for personnel who require advanced knowledge and application of the ICS. This course expands upon information covered in ICS-100 through ICS-300.
Ops	16	ICS 400	ICS-400 emphasizes large-scale organizational development, roles and relationships of the command and general staff, and planning, operational, logistical and fiscal considerations related to large and complex incident and event management.
Ops	2.5	ICS 700	This course provides training on and resources for personnel who require a basic understanding of the National Incident Management System (NIMS).
Ops	4	MCI Tabletop	Practice the essentials of MCI management.
Ops	3	MICU Utilization	ALS can make the difference between life and death. Review the capabilities of ALS; identify when ALS is needed, and when they are not.
Ops	3	NJ Transit Emergency Response Procedures	A course that familiarizes the responder with basic rail safety as well as the dangers when responding to a rail incident.
Ops	1	NJ Triage Tags	Initial triage on the MCI scene. Properly used, triage is under 30 seconds or less per patient.
Ops	4	NJSP Confined Space Awareness	Awareness of the potential hazards during confined space operations.
Ops	8	NJSP Hazmat Operations	Recognize a hazardous materials release and the risks involved. Identify the released material, how to use available resources, and how to notify the proper authorities in the event of a hazardous material emergency.
Ops	2	OSHA BBP	Blood borne Pathogens includes information on what blood borne pathogens are and how risks of exposure can be reduced.
Ops	2	Public Health Initiatives	Identification and implementation of public health initiatives for EMS providers.
Ops	3	Rehab Guidelines for Emergency Responders	Rehab Guidelines for Emergency Responders
Ops	2	Respiratory Protection with Fit Testing	Review of respiratory protection, and FIT testing.

Ops	3	Street Drugs and Overdoses	Review today's common drugs, symptoms of use and overdose, identify dangerous situations and review the most effective treatments available.
Ops	3	Team Dynamics in EMS	Incorporating the AHAs Team Dynamics into EMS Operations
Ops	8	The All Hazards Disaster Response (AHDR)	This course teaches students how to respond to the many types of disaster scenarios they may encounter, including natural disasters and infrastructure failings, fires and radiological events, pandemics, active shooter incidents, and other mass casualty events. AHDR educates participants on how to analyze potential threats in their area, assess available resources, and create a response plan that will save lives.

Ops	6	VFIS Driver Training	Driver training program through VFIS
Pediatrics	2	Keeping Children Safe in Youth Serving Organizations	Guidelines and abuse prevention techniques for youth serving organizations.
Pediatrics	8	Pediatric Emergency Assessment, Recognition and Stabilization (PEARS)	The PEARS Provider Course prepares healthcare providers caring for pediatric patients with foundational skills to assess, recognize, and participate in the initial management of respiratory and/or cardiovascular emergencies and cardiopulmonary arrest.
Pediatrics	9	Pediatric Emergency Care for the Prehospital Provider (PEPP)	Pre-hospital Pediatric Emergency Care - in-depth assessment and treatment appropriate to the developmental stage of the child.
Pediatrics	2	Sudden Infant Death Syndrome (SIDS)	Dealing with children who have died for no apparent cause is very difficult for any provider. Learn the best way to assess the child and to determine if they are a viable candidate for resuscitation. Learn what resources exist to help parents after a SIDS death.
Pediatrics	2	Understanding Adverse Childhood Experience	In depth look at adverse childhood experiences, and how they affect the adult patient.
Protocol	1	Aspirin Administration	American Heart Association Guidelines state that prehospital providers should administer aspirin to those patients who may be suffering from an acute coronary syndrome. This course covers the NJ protocols for aspirin administration.

Trauma	2	Bleeding and Shock	How to control bleeding, bandaging techniques, and shock management. Review of blood components and blood related diseases.
Trauma	2	Extreme Splinting	In extreme splinting, we will show improved techniques to perform the infamous "PMS" assessment. In addition to innovative use of traditional splint materials, we explore flexible splints and the Sager Traction Splint.

Trauma	16	International Trauma Life Support (ITLS)	ITLS gives you the knowledge and skills to provide care of trauma patients. ITLS enables you to master the latest techniques in rapid assessment, appropriate intervention and identification of immediate life threatening traumatic injuries.
Trauma	16	Pre-Hospital trauma Life Support (PHTLS)	PHTLS is designed to enhance and increase knowledge and skills in delivering critical care to trauma patients in the pre-hospital environment. Students will learn how to: identify mechanism of injury; recognize life-threatening injuries; assess and manage trauma patients; and, perform appropriate interventions prior to transporting the patient.
Trauma	8	Pre-Hospital trauma Life Support (PHTLS) Refresher Program	PHTLS is designed to enhance and increase knowledge and skills in delivering critical care to trauma patients in the pre-hospital environment. Students will learn how to: identify mechanism of injury; recognize life-threatening injuries; assess and manage trauma patients; and, perform appropriate interventions prior to transporting the patient.
Trauma	2	Spinal Motion Restriction Protocols RWJUH	Spinal Motion Restriction protocols
Trauma	3	Sports Injuries & Athletic Trainers	Identify, treat, transport, and remove your injured athlete from their equipment. Work with athletic trainers for best patient outcomes.
Trauma	2	START Triage & NJ Triage Tags	START is a highly efficient tool for initial triage on the MCI scene. Properly used, START enables effective triage in 30 seconds or less.
Trauma	2	Stop the Bleed	Stop the Bleed is intended to cultivate grassroots efforts that encourage bystanders to become trained, equipped, and empowered to help in a bleeding emergency before professional help arrives.
Trauma	3	Trauma Triage and Transport	Guidelines have been developed to assist the pre-hospital provider in determining when to take an injured patient to a trauma center in New Jersey.

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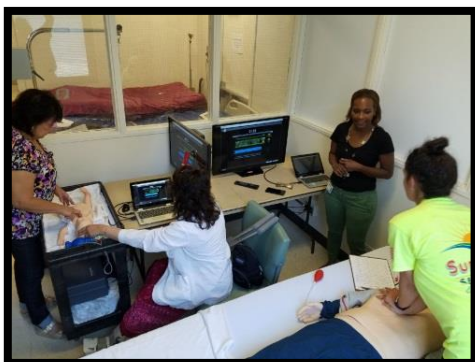
