- The selected scholarship recipient will have the opportunity to rotate through our emergency department including the adult ED, pediatric ED, fast track area and our observation unit.
- They will work alongside our dedicated and talented residents and faculty that have specialty interests in Ultrasound, EMS & Disaster Medicine, Pain and Addiction, and Simulation.
- **The selected students will be granted a \$1000 stipend** that must be used to defray costs related to food, housing, transportation and other costs related to the EM rotation at Newark Beth Israel.

Application Information & Criteria

Eligible applicants must meet the following criteria:

1. Senior 4th year medical student in good standing at an accredited allopathic or osteopathic medical school
2. Satisfactory completion of core MS3 clerkships
3. Self-identification of minority or disadvantaged status:
Traditionally excluded from opportunity:
racial/ethnic minority group (Black, Latino, Native American, Pacific Islander)
Gender/sexual orientation minority group (LGBTQ+)
