e continue to make strides toward the opening of a truly state-of-the-art, five-story, 150,000-square-foot outpatient center at the Vogel Medical Campus in Tinton Falls. This center will offer seamless access to surgical and imaging services and comprehensive cancer care, together with Rutgers Cancer Institute of New Jersey, the state's only National Cancer Institute-designated Comprehensive Cancer Center. And while we look to the anticipated 2026 opening of this new center with tremendous excitement, we also are proud to share amazing recent accomplishments for our cancer program.

Through a highly successful RWJBarnabas Health Southern Region Thoracic Oncology Program led by Dr. Richard Lazzaro, Chief of Thoracic Surgery for the Southern Region and a renowned national leader in the field, Monmouth Medical Center (MMC) has introduced three new advanced highly precise technologies used to both diagnose and treat lung cancer. MMC is the first in central and southern New Jersey to introduce lon, a robot-assisted platform designed to enable minimally invasive lung biopsies that aid in early diagnosis. The hospital continues to expand the advanced capabilities of its thoracic oncology program, including firsts in New Jersey with the introduction of minimally invasive technology to ablate lung lesions called the Aliya PEF System and LungVision, intraoperative Al-driven CT imaging for use with the lon.

Exciting developments such as these are made possible thanks to the generosity of our forward-thinking philanthropic supporters. We are extraordinarily grateful to share in this issue news of two more significant gifts to support the Vogel Medical Campus. Our cover story details a transformative gift from legacy supporters Michael and Nancy Del Priore that will fund the installation of an advanced, 16-foot digital LED wall in the main lobby of the campus's landmark outpatient center. Additionally, we spotlight a generous gift from hospital trustee Valerie Montecalvo and her husband, Frank, that will name the Montecalvo Family Infusion Room.

We are also tremendously proud to share that MMC has been named to Newsweek's 2024 World's Best Hospitals' list. There will be dedicated floors exclusively for cancer services, including a comprehensive oncology clinic and centers for infusion and radiation therapy treatment.

The Del Priore family will fund the installation of an advanced, 16-foot digital LED wall in the main lobby of the inaugural building of the Vogel Medical Campus. This cutting-edge technology will be a dynamic platform that showcases the rich history and ongoing philanthropic endeavors that have shaped Monmouth County's healthcare landscape. The "Nancy and Michael Del Priore and Family" LED wall will highlight stories of generosity and community support to underscore the significance of MMC's evolution as a healthcare provider. It will recognize the generous families from our past, present, and future who are pivotal to our growth. Its impressive size ensures that it will serve as a prominent focal point. As a trustee on the Monmouth Medical Center (MMC) Operational Board, Valerie has served as a trusted advisor for our hospital's leaders for years. With a significant footprint on the fifth floor at the outpatient center, therapeutic infusion care will support patients with a variety of needs from brief visits in community infusion bays to private rooms for those patients who may require more intensive symptom management. Designed with a range of comfortable spaces, the infusion floor will have inviting areas for companions, designated areas for patients' personal belongings, ambient lighting, privacy screens, and finishes throughout to maximize patient comfort.

In 2026, when MMC expands to the Vogel Medical Campus, our community will benefit from a new facility that prioritizes cutting-edge medical care, patient comfort, and accessibility. The Vogel Medical Campus will be just 15 minutes away from the Long Branch Campus, allowing for seamless coordination between facilities based on patient needs. In partnership with Rutgers Cancer Institute of New Jersey, the Vogel Medical Campus will bring a comprehensive cancer care center to Monmouth County; with patient comfort and ease of access top of mind, patients will be able to access the hospital's outpatient surgery, infusion, and imaging services in one place.

Anne Vogel Family Care and Wellness LiveWell Center

The LiveWell Center, located within the Anne Vogel Family Care and Wellness Center in Eatontown, is a hub for all things wellness related serving community members of all ages. The Livewell Center emphasizes education through workshops on topics including nutrition, chronic diseases, mental health, childbirth and postpartum health. Programs are free and open to all members of the community, with no insurance required.

Among the most active participants is Tinton Falls resident Terry Ullmann, a retired nurse who attends as many as three programs a week. Terry has had an expansive nursing career including two years as a neonatal intensive care nurse at Monmouth Medical Center (MMC) and tenures in public health, school nursing and a pediatrician's office. She took her first class at the LiveWell Center in August of 2022 after seeing information on the MMC website. She's been active ever since, noting she particularly enjoys the cooking and movement classes.

"From my very first class, I found I really like coming here - they do a wonderful job and I'm always greeted with a smile whenever I walk in," said Terry, who grew up in Bayonne and moved to Monmouth County more than 50 years ago. "I'm not one to talk much, but I've made friends here; there is such great camaraderie and the community they've created is fantastic. From the support groups, to the programs for babies and toddlers and teens to get them excited about healthy eating - I love being a part of something that is truly for all age groups."

The Community Health Education team aims to equip individuals with knowledge, skills, and support to improve health outcomes, with a specific focus on vulnerable populations. "Our programs focus on preventing chronic diseases and helping those with a diagnosis to make behavior changes that can allow them to live a longer, healthier life," says Abigail Thompson, MPH, CHES, Regional Program Director, Community Health and Social Impact & Community Investment. "Programs are data-driven and tailored to meet the needs of individuals at every age and stage of life. We also place a focus on reaching underserved and vulnerable populations. We strive to connect community members to needed healthcare services in their community, and work beyond the walls of this center and our hospital to embed ourselves in the communities we serve."





The Hirair and Anna Hovnanian Foundation Neonatal Intensive Care Unit Big Steps for Little Feet 2023

little rain did not dampen the spirits of the participants at the 17th annual Big Steps for Little Feet event on Sunday, October 15, 2023. The event moved indoors to the gym at Long Branch Middle School where over 150 attendees joined in the festivities. There were refreshments and fall fun activities including pumpkin picking and bouncy houses for the little ones to enjoy.

This peer-to-peer fundraising event raised over \$40,000 for the Hirair and Anna Hovnanian Foundation Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) at Monmouth Medical Center (MMC). The event was chaired by NICU nurse Kristin Chaparro, who said "Our NICU, which celebrated its 55th anniversary this year, is a very special place created at MMC for our tiniest, most fragile patients to receive constant monitoring and 24-hour care." To have so many of the NICU families attend this event is especially meaningful for the nurses and physicians who develop an immeasurable bond with the families. Many families return to this event year after year, thankful for a positive experience during an incredibly difficult time.

The event honored two former NICU patients, including Mila Simoes, who weighed 1 pound 4 ounces and was 12 inches long when she was born January 25, 2021 at 25 weeks and 4 days. The second honoree was Ava Sosnowski, who weighed 2 pounds, 11 ounces and measured 14.5 inches when she was born prematurely on April 30, 2021. Mila was discharged after nearly four months in the NICU, and Ava following a 66-day stay.

The NICU is uniquely equipped to meet the needs of infants like Mila and Ava who are born too early or too small, or who require special care or surgery. The Unterberg Children's Hospital board-certified neonatologists and nursing team specialize in family-centered treatment, providing a multidisciplinary experience to give every baby their best chance to thrive, while offering comfort and convenience for families.

Melissa woke up that morning and felt amazing. She recalls feeling a positive energy around her and she felt strong physically. Everything was calm and then without any warning, everything changed. Within the span of two hours the calmness went away, and a sense of unease filled her mind and heart. She knew something was terribly off.

When they arrived at Monmouth Medical Center (MMC), Melissa was filled with uncertainty while experiencing the physical signs of labor. The medical team felt it best to admit her for overnight observation. However, her situation escalated quickly and emergency surgery was necessary. Despite everything looking like it would be fine when she went into the operating room, their son, Redford Ames DiTella was born on February 13, 2023, with no signs of life, not breathing and without a heartbeat.

Melissa remained in emergency surgery, while the incredible MMC Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) team quickly whisked Redford away. The skilled NICU staff performed CPR on Redford for nine minutes, saving his life. Shortly after, Dad, Luke, was in the room with his newborn as the situation was explained to him. "It was difficult to watch our son lay there, but the team was transparent and explained everything in the easiest way so I could understand it in these critical moments. Processing everything that was happening around me was a blur, but they brought a sense of peace during the challenging scene that was unfolding in front of me. They are truly angels on earth," said Luke.

After surgery, Melissa's traumatic experience would leave some feeling broken, but her head and her heart were hopeful because she knew Redford was in the best hands. Her son was receiving around the clock care and compassion from the right team of people, as they acted as the extension of her heart to his. Redford spent just shy of a month in the NICU. The first 36 hours were the hardest, knowing this was the most critical time and that each time they saw him, they knew they could lose him. However, Luke and Melissa noted that the doctors and nurses had just as much resiliency as the babies, consistently transparent, inviting them to daily rounds, explaining every step of Redford's healing, and recovery. Melissa believed deep down that the NICU would make them whole again, and they would be home as a family of four before they knew it - even if that timeline felt far away. "The NICU team was amazing. It is the family that you never expected to be a part of, and once you are, you're welcomed by everyone with open arms," Melissa said.

On Redford's due date, by a poetic twist of fate, Luke and Melissa were informed by the NICU team that he was ready to go home. This was highlighted by the incredible sight of Redford being held without tubes, as well as a group of nurses dancing and celebrating at their station. This was a sentimental moment they will always remember. Luke said, "I cannot quantify the gratitude we have for the NICU team and to know we could finally bring him home. This place felt like an extension of our family, and it is because of them, we were able to even have this moment."
